Duties:

As a senior financial examiner, this position plans, conducts and supervises the field and/or in-office financial examinations of nationally significant (as defined by the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC)) and other insurance companies. Performs advanced reviews of examination work papers, reinsurance, investments, automated systems, management assessment, training needs and coordination, etc., and is responsible for timely submission of draft reports for supervisory review.

This position is responsible for the direct supervision of six or more financial examiners. Performs evaluations, ensures required training is conducted, and implements state personnel/union rules and procedures for performance management, both disciplinary and non-disciplinary.

<u>Knowledge of</u>: Principles, practices, techniques and methods of accounting and auditing; insurance examination and regulations; insurance laws and Insurance Commissioner's rulings and related Attorney General Opinions and court decisions; insurance company practices; statistical sampling procedures; basic actuarial mathematics; principles and practices of effective supervision.

Qualifications:

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS

Bachelor's Degree involving major study in accounting, business administration, economics, or finance, with a minimum of 36 quarter hours or 24 semester hours of accounting.

AND

Five years of qualifying professional experience in accounting or auditing, two years of which must have been in a supervisory, lead, or administrative capacity.

A Bachelor's Degree with 225 quarter hours or 150 semester hours or a Master's Degree in accounting or business administration with a minimum of 36 hours or 24 semester hours of accounting may substitute for one year of the experience.

Designation of Certified Financial Examiner (CFE) in insurance discipline as granted by the Society of Financial Examiners; or Certified Public Accountant (CPA) certificate granted by Washington State, or any state in the U.S. having

reciprocity with Washington State.

Qualifying professional accounting or auditing experience is defined as experience as an accountant, auditor or examiner with a public accounting firm or as an accountant, internal or external auditor or examiner or insurance companies, banks, savings and loan associations, municipalities, etc., Federal agencies, or private organizations.

Career Development Seminar

Roshanak "Roshi" Fekrat, CFE, CPA, CIA

The CDS committee is responsible for the agenda of this annual program, procuring all of the speakers and topics, and working with the Certified Meeting Planner and headquarters staff in planning this event from conception to wrap-up.

Continuing Regulatory Education

Colette Hogan Sawyer, CFE

The CRE committee reviews and/or approves all sponsors of CRE credit in conjunction with headquarters staff. They oversee the work performed by headquarters staff in the review and approval of the annual CRE Reporting Forms submitted by designees and the CRE audits performed annually. Marketing

The Marketing committee is responsible for SOFE name recognition within the insurance industry and working on membership growth.

Nominations

New Procedure Regarding the Shelf Life of Examinations: New Conditional Credit Policy for SOFE Exams

The Insurance Examination Committee (Committee) recently reviewed the length a passing grade for both the Accredited Financial Examiner designation (AFE) and the Certified Financial Examiner designation (CFE) tests were available for use in obtaining these designations. The Committee recommended and the Executive Committee approved the following conditional credit policy for SOFE's professional designation tests.

Effective January 1, 2011, a candidate for Accredited Financial Examiner designation (AFE) and Certified Financial Examiner designation (CFE) will be subject to the conditional credit policy as stated below:

The passing grade for each of the tests of the Accredited Financial Examiner designation (AFE) is 60. A candidate who passes any test of the AFE will earn conditional credit for that test. This conditional credit expires 36 months after the testing date. If a candidate does not successfully pass the remaining tests within the 36 months, the test associated with the conditional credit must be retaken.

The passing grade for each of the tests of the Certified Financial Examiner designation (CFE) is 66. A candidate who passes any test of the CFE will earn conditional credit for that test. This conditional credit expires 36 months after the testing date. If a candidate does not successfully pass the remaining tests within the 36 months, the test associated with the conditional credit must be retaken.

Tests taken on and after 1/1/09 will expire 36 months after the date the test was passed. Tests passed prior to 1/1/09 will expire on 1/1/12.

Listed below are three examples of the implications of the new conditional credit policy:

Example 1 – A candidate has three of the four AFE tests passed as of December 31, 2008. The credit on these three exams expires on January 1, 2012. Therefore if the candidate fails to pass the forth AFE test before December 31, 2011, the four previously passed exams would be nullified and have to be retaken.

Example 2 - A candidate has three of the four AFE tests passed with the earliest being passed on March 1, 2011. The credit on the earliest exam expires on February 28, 2014. Therefore if the candidate fails to pass the fourth AFE test before February 28, 2014, the earliest previously passed exam would be nullified and have to be retaken.

Example 3 – A candidate has one of the three CFE tests passed. CFE 1 was passed on March 1, 2011. The candidate passes CFE 2 on September 1, 2012. If the candidate fails to pass CFE 3 by February 28, 2014, the conditional credit expires for CFE 1 and the candidate will have to retake CFE 1.

The Committee will be developing a similar policy for the Automated Examination Specialist AES designation as well.
